

June Meeting Minutes ~ AJ Perea, Secretary

The Mile High Magicians Society hosted Mentalism Night to start the summer season on Wonders HUB stage at 40 West. Our president, **Dan Rodriguez** emceed the event.

Jeff Jenson started the evening with a balloon with a card inside. He could narrow down a selected card to the king of spades with the audience's guidance. The selected card was inside the balloon and Jeff had a larger spare card in case anyone doubted his prediction.

Nick Lathrop had three members of the audience select three items: a word from a book, a card, and a number. He was then able to find the selected card in the deck at the number that was predicted by an audience member. As for the word, it was

computer printed on a piece of paper.

Gene Gordon brought up a spectator from the audience. He guessed their birthday just by using the cards. He had them select a card. Based on their birthday converting it to numbers, he was able to find the card in the deck.

Jude Griffin brought a drawing of a house. He selected a member of the audience to color the drawing. The spectator would roll a dice corresponding to a marker. Based on this randomness, the drawing would be colored in. The spectator's version exactly matched Jude's predicted drawing.

Shawn Preston had one member of the audience select a country that wanted to visit. He had another member of the audience elect a famous person. He was able to correctly predict both Australia and Elvis.

Keir Royale was able to correctly predict the next face card in a shuffled deck of cards. The spectator would deal cards until they stopped at a face card. Each time, he correctly predicted the suit and value.

One by one, they were able to correctly answer these questions. Even more amazing, they were able to predict questions that were not originally answered. The Deans Magical Musings - Gene Gordon


Hello fellow Mile High Magicians,
