



The theme of the night was "New Members and Grand Masters". **Chad Wonder** emceed. The evening began with honoring a grandmaster that we recently lost. **Dave Elston** had been a member of our organization for over forty years and served as our president four times. His incredible humor, talent, knowledge, and service to the club will always be remembered fondly by our members. To honor his

Jackson learned fast and upstaged his mother by pulling more impressive items out of his bag. This included pulling dollar bills instead of coins, links of sausage instead of a rubber banana, and a large colored streamer instead of a smaller one.

Walter Holak performed the Chinese Sticks. Each stick had a tassel and a string. Despite the sticks being disconnected, the tassels on the sticks seemed to move together. A young spectator from the audience helped him produce a variety of objects from his square and circle including a toothbrush, a sock, and vivid streamers.

the power of voodoo. He took the fake card and proceeded to tear a corner off and lightly burn it with a lighter. The selected card was then revealed to be burnt and torn as well.




